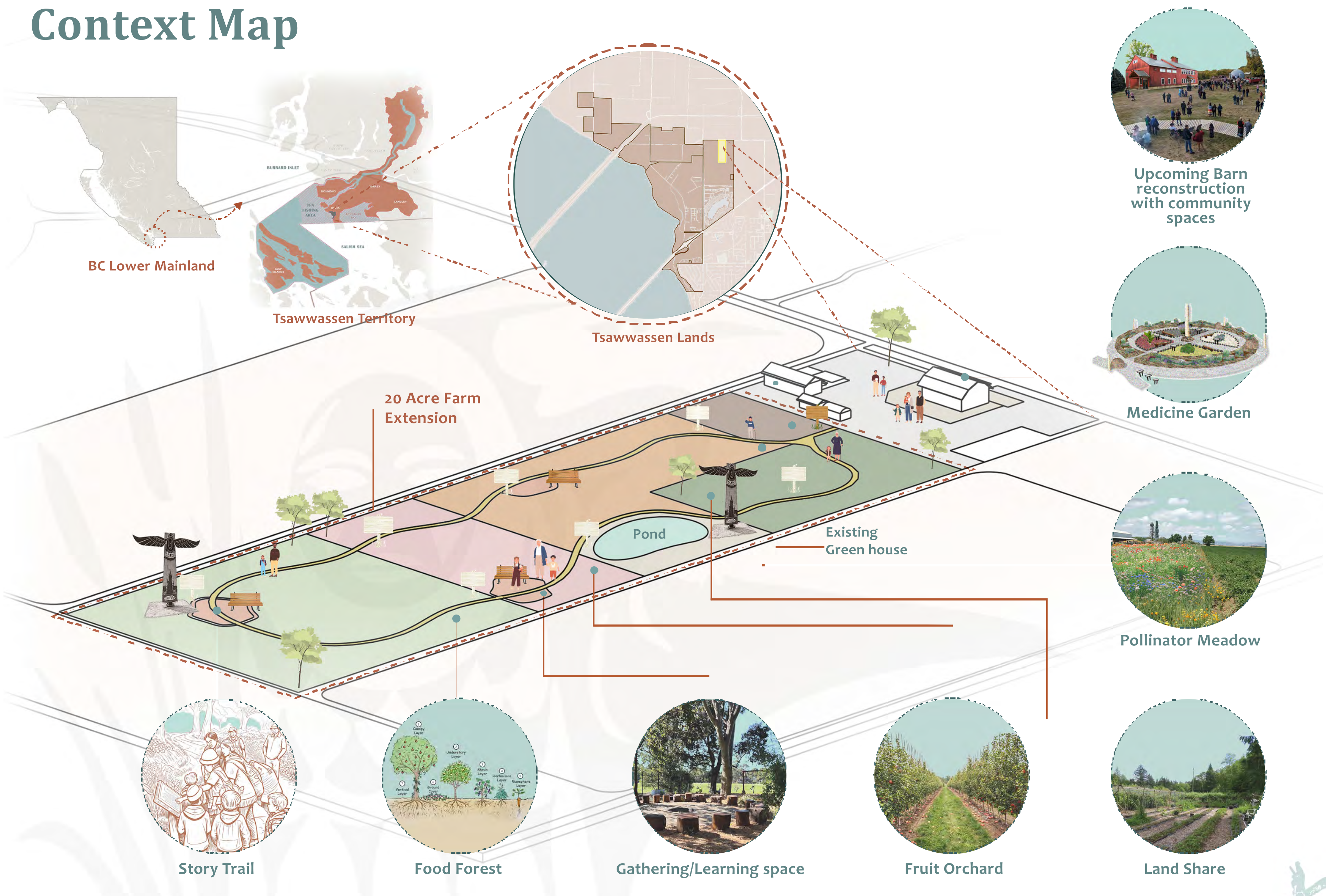
## Connect

The land uses, including a pollinator meadow, a food forest, and gatherings in the new barn, will cultivate land stewardship. This approach blends tradition, sustainability, and education, focusing on low-maintenance, easily funded stewardship practices.
